

History of the Tours

Because of drought and loss of habitat the Greater Prairie Chicken was designated as a Colorado endangered species in 1973. Through the efforts of the Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife and local landowners an intensive study and relocation program was conducted in the 80s and 90s. The birds began to recover and in 1998 they were down listed to a state species of concern.

In an effort to educate the public about these unique birds the Greater Prairie Chicken Tours were started in 1994. The East Yuma County Historical Society and Wray Chamber of Commerce partner together to make these tours possible with the gracious help and knowledge of the Colorado Division of Parks and Wildlife and the Kitzmiller Grazing Association.

The rolling sandhills north of Wray provide an excellent habitat for this member of the grouse family. The Greater Prairie Chicken has thrived and is once again listed as a state game species.

We thank you for deciding to attend one of our tours to learn more about these birds. Whether you are a birder at heart, or becoming one, we know you will enjoy the tour and will leave with a greater appreciation of

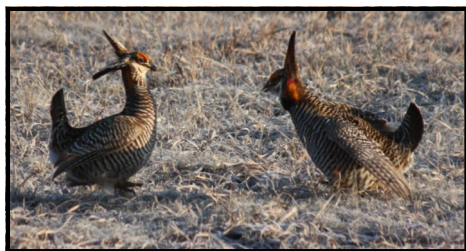
